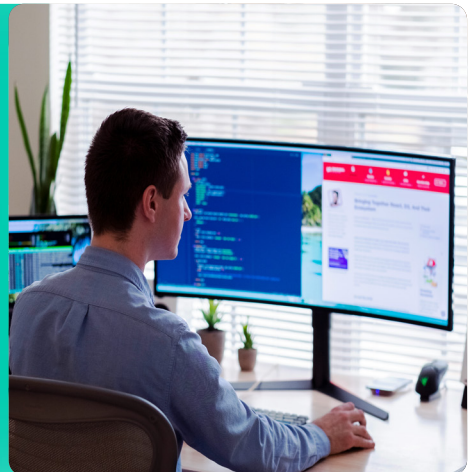
Technical Environment Evaluation

- **Device inventory:** What computers, tablets, and phones must work with the new system?

Migration Strategy Development

Step 1: Create a Phased Migration Plan

Breaking your migration into manageable phases helps control both complexity and risk:

- 1. Discovery and Planning (4-8 weeks):** Complete your assessment, build your project team, and map out detailed schedules.
- 2. Pilot Migration (2-4 weeks):** First, move a small test group of 5-10% of users. Microsoft FastTrack data shows that good pilot programs lead to 60% fewer problems during full rollout. Ensure that your pilot group has logistic skills and knows how to guarantee that no key information is lost during the migration.
- 3. Core Service Migration (8-12 weeks):** Set up security settings and move departments over individually.
- 4. Full Deployment (6-12 weeks):** Finish moving mailboxes and collaborative documents. Migrate over the weekend to ensure minimal disruption.
- 5. Optimization and Decommissioning (4-8 weeks):** Verify everything moved successfully and plan to reduce Google licenses. We advise that you maintain the old work environment for at least 30 days to minimize data loss.

For your pilot group, include people from each department and both casual and power users. When deciding which departments to move first, consider:

- Teams with lower business impact if something goes wrong
- Groups with fewer special applications
- Departments that adapt well to new technology
- Teams with strong internal champions for the change

Harvard's research shows that moving departments in structured sequences while also evaluating department interdependencies will help identify a company's optimal structure.

Step 2: Implement Change Management

The technical side is only half the battle – getting people to use the new system is equally important.

Develop communication that speaks to different groups:

- **For end users:** Answer "what's in it for me" questions and provide clear timelines. End users will be most new users and should be supported with training sessions and through QAs.

Build a network of power users across departments to champion change. According to [Prosci](#), migrations with good change management are six times more likely to meet their goals.

Set up feedback channels using Microsoft Forms to capture concerns throughout the process. This will help you fix issues quickly and show users that you're listening to their needs.

Technical Migration Implementation

Step 1: Configure Identity and Access

Your identity management forms the foundation of your migration:

- 1. Set up Azure AD Connect:** This tool syncs your existing directory with Azure Active Directory, creating the bridge between your environments.
 - 2. Choose your authentication approach:** Based on your security requirements, choose between password hash synchronization, pass-through authentication, or federation.
 - 3. Map user accounts:** Make sure Google accounts align with Microsoft identities, paying attention to naming differences.
 - 4. Turn on multi-factor authentication (MFA):** Add this security layer from day one. Microsoft Security reports that organizations using MFA and conditional access policies see 99.9% fewer account compromises.
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Step 2: Migrate Email and Calendars

- 3. Convert sharing settings:** Carefully map Google's sharing model to Microsoft's permissions structure.
- 4. Plan for specialized content:** Create specific approaches for Google Sites and Forms and decide whether to rebuild them in SharePoint and Microsoft Forms.
